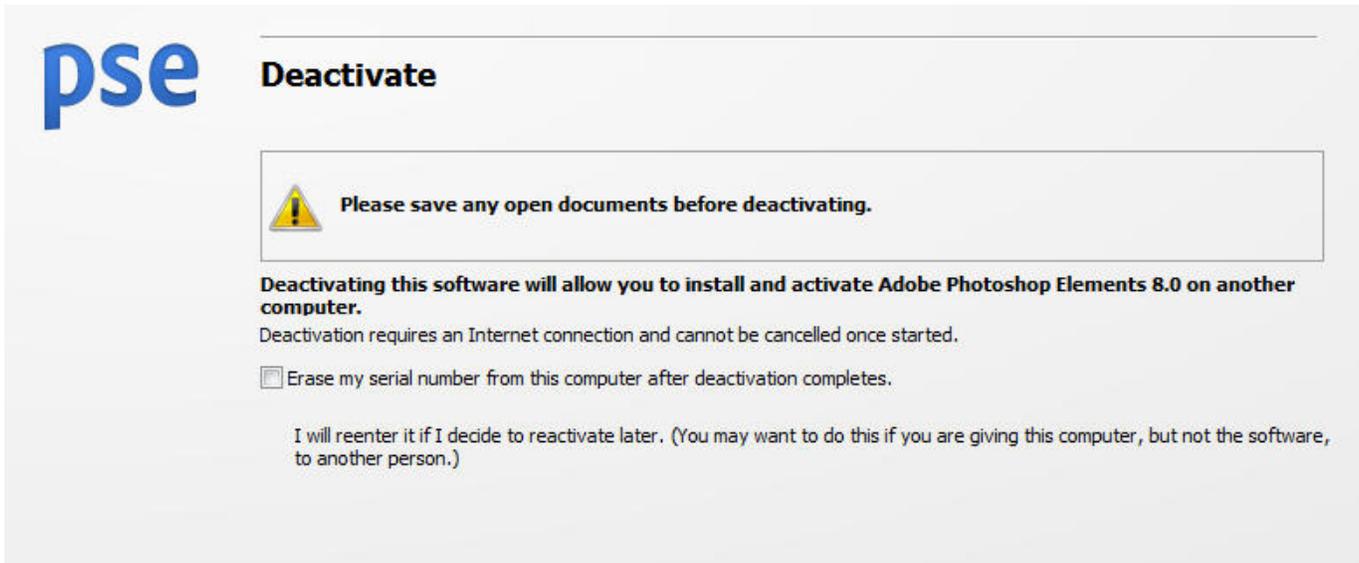
Photoshop Elements 8

You all probably know that when you purchase Photoshop Elements 8 (or Premier Elements 8) you are buying a license for installing on two machines which should not be used at the same time. In past versions this was a moot point as there was no tracking done by Adobe. However I recently purchased a new laptop and installed Elements 8 onto it. I had already installed it on my desktop and my old laptop (which I am going to wipe clean and sell) but imagine my surprise when I got this message when I opened Photoshop Elements 8!

I have never encountered this before and I was very surprised. It appears I must first deactivate the software on either my desktop or old laptop before the new installation becomes valid.

To deactivate is quite easy and if you make a note of the serial number (I did change the number in the image above!) you can always reactivate it again on the machine after deactivating on the new one. To do this open the software and click on help>deactivate and this screen appears:



Note you need an internet connection to allow the deactivation. It is quite simple but it has put an end to using the same software serial number numerous times.

Photoshop Elements User Magazine

Onone Software

Onone software has just come out with their latest version of "PhotoEssentials3" for Adobe Photoshop Elements. This program which is an easily installed plug in has five main functions:

1. **Make it better:** Compare and select images in a step by step wizard to make photos look their best
2. **Cut it Out:** If you like the subject but not the background then this is the plug in for you. Simply use the magic brush and pen to solve the problem.

3. **Make it Cool:** Add professional photo effects to any image.
4. **Frame It:** Add one or combine multiple frames to your photos.
5. **Enlarge it:** Get sharp poster size prints from your photographs no matter how small the original may be.

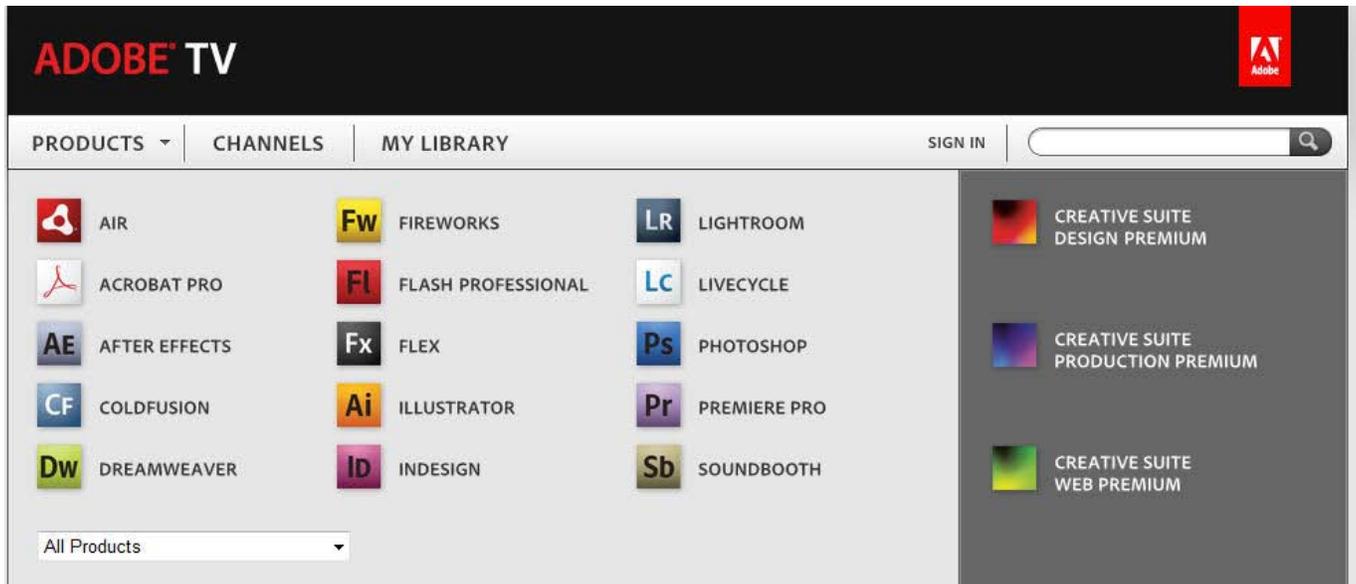
As an example of the camera here is a picture taken of the recent snow on Mount Diablo.



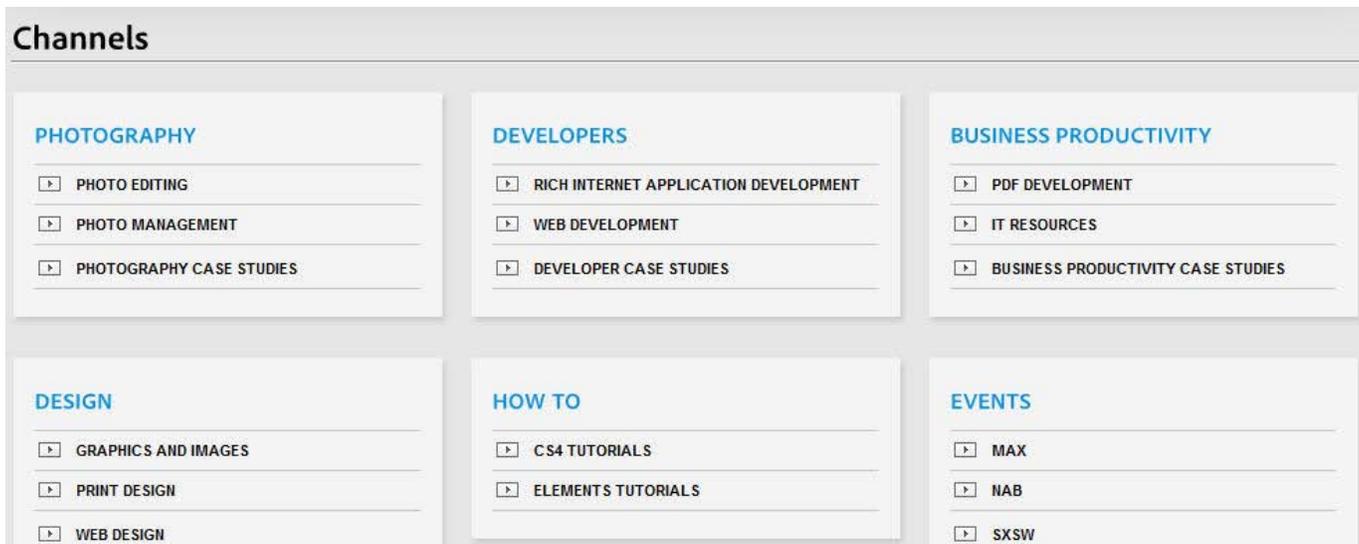
Adobe TV
